What is Puke Ariki?

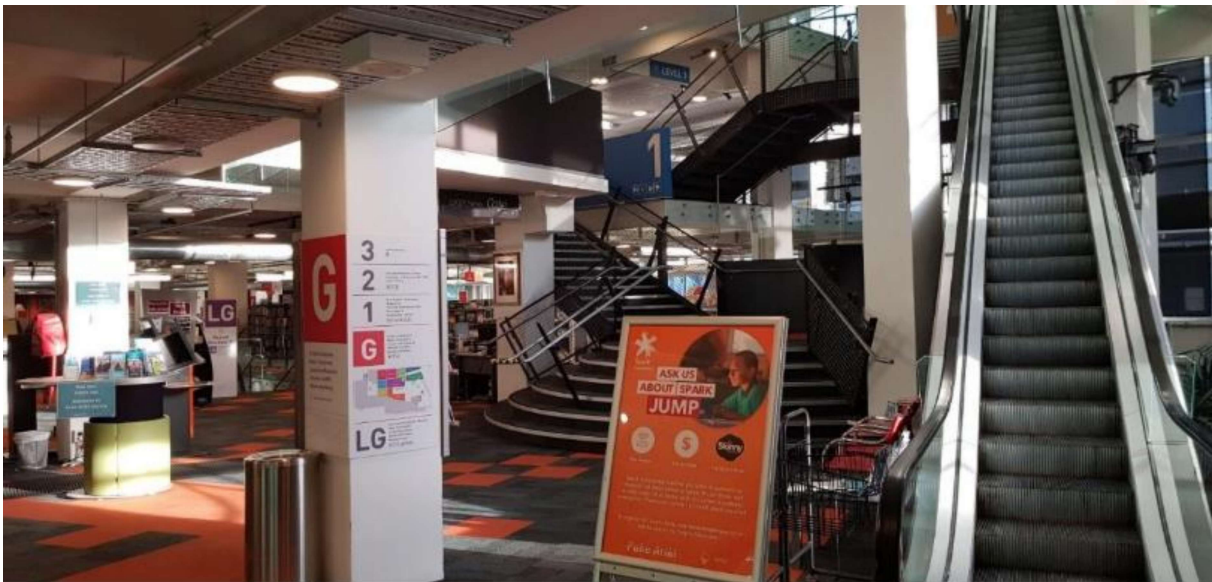
Puke Ariki is a special place with a library, museum and information centre.

The library has a children's area called Discover It!, a research centre, and books for adults too.

Discover It! has different spaces with books for children of all ages. There are also magazines, audiobooks and computers to use.

How to get to DiscoverIt!

When I walk into the library, I will see an escalator and a Help Desk. The escalator might be moving or still.



Discover It is downstairs

To get there, I can use these stairs



Or use this ramp



Or this Lift



Inside Discover It!

I will listen to my teacher, who will tell me and my classmates where to sit.

If I have a school bag, I will put it in the bag trolley when my teacher tells me to.



Ngā Kaimahi - Library Staff

Many helpful people work at Puke Ariki.

They wear blue lanyards and badges with this logo
on it.

Puke Ariki

If I feel lost, overwhelmed, or have a question, I can
ask a staff member for help.



Ngā wharepaku - Toilets

If I need to go to the bathroom, will tell my teacher or another adult, and they will take me to the bathroom.

There may be other people in the bathroom as well.

I will remember to flush the toilet and wash my hands.



Kai me te wai - Food and Water

If my teacher says it's snack time, I can eat and drink
in Discover It!

I will sit down and put my rubbish in the bin.



Akomanga - Education Class

My class might have a special lesson with a museum teacher.

My teacher will introduce them to me and my classmates.

The Library teacher will welcome us to Puke Ariki and ask questions.

I will listen carefully and try to sit still.

If I want to answer a question, I will put my hand up first and wait until it is my turn to speak.



Discover it! Spaces

The library has spaces and books.

Some areas might be loud, dark or bright.

I will wait for my teacher to tell me when and where I can explore. I will stay on the same floor in

Discover it!

If I feel uncomfortable, I will tell an adult who will take me to quiet space to have a break.



Visual Schedule

Here is what my visit might look like:

1. Arrive at the library – (I might be welcomed at the Museum first)
2. Enter the building
3. Sit with my class
4. Be introduced to the teachers
5. Attend a special lesson
6. Eat and drink
7. Use the bathroom if needed
8. Say goodbye and leave
