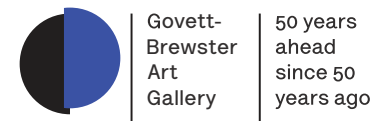

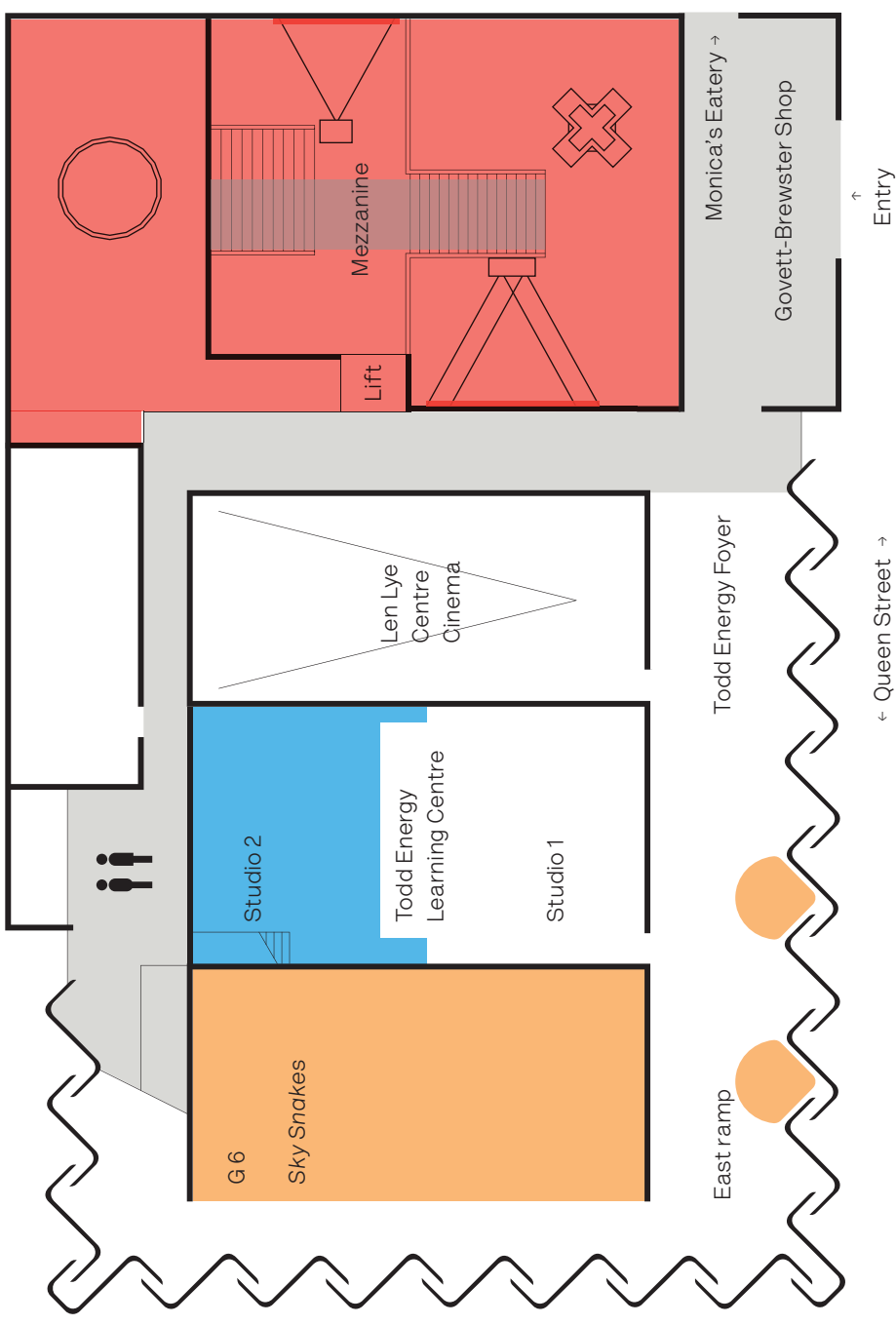
Ground level
